# Welcome to your Boaters' Guide

# About the test version

This is a test version of the Canal & River Trust's new Boaters' Guides. The guides provide boating information in a clear, easy-to-download PDF, ready to be printed out or saved to your tablet or smartphone.

This PDF is just an example of what the guides will look like. The factual information contained within it isn't complete, and hasn't been checked - don't worry about that for now. We're interested in hearing your comments on the overall appearance and presentation of the guides.

#### How it works

Every day, a new Boaters' Guide is generated for each waterway using the Canal & River Trust's mapping and navigational data - everything from locks and bridges to stoppages and advice. Some data changes very rarely (locks), some frequently (stoppages). Because the guides are regenerated every day, your download will always be up-to-date with the latest information.

Unlike most waterway maps, which are drawn by hand, these maps are entirely computer-generated. The computer does all the work of juggling the map symbols and labels to get everything to fit in. This is what permits new guides to be generated every day.

Many of the waterway features are marked with a number. This means there's more information in the text below or beside the map.

#### What's new?

Since 2005, the Canal & River Trust website (and its predecessor, Waterscape.com) have provided Boaters' Guides for download. This new system has been rewritten from scratch and has many improvements over the previous version.

First, the maps are greatly improved. They now show towpaths, roads, and built-up areas. Label placement is much smarter, which means more bridge and lock names can be shown.

Second, the information can be kept upto-date. The original guides used an old database which was no longer updated with the latest navigation information.

Third, the content is much more flexible. As well as the basic information about locks, bridges, facilities and stoppages, we'll be able to include general navigational advice for each waterway. We can even include diagrams of signs, photos, and other illustrations to help you with the situations you might encounter on the water.

And as you'll have noticed, the guides are now in colour (though we've

designed them so the maps are still clear if you print them in black and white). We've also taken the opportunity to have a cover for each guide, using the delightful woodcuts drawn by John O'Connor for the very first British Waterways pleasure cruising guides in the 1950s.

#### Known issues



Don't worry about that for now - it's the design and appearance of the guides we're testing.

The waterway line is missing for several short stretches of waterway. This is a data issue and will be fixed in the final guides.







  There are visitor moorings both on the towpath (360m length) and in the new 32-berth basin, which includes water and electric supplies. During the summer months there is a mooring attendant present. There is a charge and the maximum stay is 48 hours. Please telephone 01606 723800 for more information. Boaters can stay free up to 4pm and staff are on site until approximately 8pm to take bookings. There is no pre booking service.
